

OFFERTORY COLLECTION

Fr Daley and the Finance Committee
met again this week to discuss finances.

In a few weeks time, Father will send a
letter to every parishioner with details
of our position and a request to review
their offertory contribution, whether
standing order, gift aid envelope or
planned giving. He will also speak at
the next Mass as appropriate.

joining the gift aid scheme, as the

Last year our parish reclaimed approx
£2,700 through gift aid, which is a
great bonus, but to put into context, this
does not even meet the annual cost of
maintaining our grounds, despite all
our groundsman being volunteers.

Of-course, we are extremely grateful,
and wish to acknowledge those who
have continued to contribute since
March, those who have increased their
offerings and everyone who has found
extra ways to donate.

On a more cheerful note, the committee
discussed having a **post COVID parish
re-launch**, when the pandemic has
subsided, with some exciting events in
mind. It would be a lovely way to

SAINT THIS WEEK

St Hugh of Lincoln 17 November
Born in Burgundy around 1135, he
became a Carthusian at age of 16.

When the Charterhouse of Witham,
near Frome, was founded, he was
sent by King Henry II to become
Prior. At first he refused because
people had been evicted from their
homes to make room for the new
buildings. Only when they had been
compensated did he take office.

In 1186 he was appointed to Lincoln,
the largest diocese in the country
and proved a good bishop. Injustice
quickly aroused his anger, seen in his
blunt refusal to the King when he
demanded benefices for his
courtiers.

You can see a stained glass window
on the North (left) side of our church
depicting St. Hugh with a wild swan,
apparently his constant companion.
