FAITH AND FREEDOM**

#Red Wednesday, is an Aid to the
Church in Need initiative that draws
attention to the human rights tragedy
of Christians and other religious
persecution.

Pope Francis calls us to pray for the
persecuted when he reminds us that
“Today there are more martyrs than in
the first ages; but the media says nothing
about them, because its not news.”

Whilst we are at home, could we
mark **#Red Wednesday** by praying
for the 200m suffering Christians
throughout the world, and for all
who are keeping the Faith alive in
hidden places – modern catacombs –
especially the underground church in
China?

When our Church re-opens for public
worship, could we consider going to
an extra Mass and offering it for the
persecuted Christians in North Korea,
Syria, Nigeria and so many other
countries, who are risking persecution
or even death to receive Jesus in the
Eucharist?

This year has been challenging for
Christians all over the world, with
churches closed and limited access to
Mass. However, for those who
**permanently live in fear because of their
peacefully held beliefs** and are
therefore denied Mass, let us proclaim
our solidarity with them.

As a symbol of our solidarity we will
be illuminating our Church in red light
this **Wednesday 25 November** and for
the following week.
