SAINT JOSEPH

Everything we know about the
husband of Mary and the foster
father of Jesus comes from Scripture.

Despite his humble work and means,
Joseph came from a royal lineage
and both Luke and Matthew mark his
descent from David, the greatest
king of Israel.

We know he was a carpenter, a
working man and poor. Since Joseph
does not appear in Jesus' public life,
at his death or resurrection, many
historians believe Joseph probably
had died before Jesus entered
public ministry.

Joseph is the patron saint of the
dying because, assuming he died
before Jesus' public life, he died
with Jesus and Mary close to him, the
way we all would like to leave this
earth.

We celebrate two feast days for St
Joseph: 19 March for St Joseph the
Husband of Mary, and 1 May for St
Joseph the Worker. (This is also
International Workers' Day.)

He is also patron saint of the
Universal Church, families, fathers,
expectant mothers, travellers,
immigrants, house sellers and buyers,
craftsmen, engineers, and working
people in general.

There is much we still wish we could
know about Joseph; exactly where
and when he was born, how he spent
his days, exactly when and how he
died. Scripture however, has left us
with the most important
knowledge—who he was;
"a righteous man". (Matthew 1:18).
