

THE DREAM OF SAINT JOSEPH, BY PHILIPPE DE CHAMPAIGNE

1642 In today's Gospel, Matthew is describing how the angel appeared to St Joseph in a dream. Joseph, with his carpenter's tools at his feet, is fast asleep. Usually in art St Joseph is portrayed as an old man, so it is unusual to see him portrayed, perhaps more accurately, as a young man at the time he would have had his dream. The angel stretches the width of the painting and thus visually bridges the distance between Our Lady and St Joseph. The angel is gesturing towards both heaven (source of the light that is falling on the angel) and the Virgin Mary, confirming that Christ has been conceived through the Holy Spirit. Kneeling in front of an open bible, as Scripture will be fulfilled with the birth of her Son, Mary looks up to the angel, her arms crossed over her chest.
