SAINTS OF THE WEEK

SAINT PETER 29 June

Peter, leader of the Apostles, was called Simon. Andrew, his brother, introduced him to Christ who changed his name to Peter. Peter and Andrew were both fishermen.

St Peter, appointed the Leader of the infant Church subsequently denied Christ three times.

SAINT PAUL 29 June

Born a Jew named Saul, he took part in the stoning of Stephen, the first Martyr.

Paul saw a vision of Christ on the way to Damascus, which changed the course of his life. His name was changed to Paul and he was martyred in 67 AD in Rome. Saint Paul is buried in Rome

SAINT THOMAS 3 July

Thomas is renowned among the Apostles chiefly because of his lack of faith which was dispelled when the risen Christ appeared to him. He proclaimed what is in fact the Easter faith of the Church when he said "My Lord and my God". Nothing certain is known of his life apart from what is given in the Gospels, but tradition has it that he preached to the people of India. From the sixth century a Feast of the translation of the relics has been kept at Edessa on 3 July

COMMUNION OF THE SICK
